At Lancaster High School, we have been extremely pleased with the first few days with our three concert bands. Over the next few months each band will be working diligently in class to develop their overall band sound, focusing on tone, tuning, blend, and balance. Our first performance of the year will be on Thursday, December 12.

At Thomas Ewing and General Sherman the directors' focus has been on our sixth grade beginning band. Throughout the last year we have made many improvements to our recruitment and retention process. We are delighted to be working with our largest beginning band class in recent years... over 140 beginners between the two schools. If you ever get the opportunity to chat with a new band member or parent, be sure to encourage commitment to the band program. The future is very bright for the Lancaster Bands!

On a housekeeping note, we again ask that all vehicles that are picking up band members after a performance or rehearsal stay clear of the fire lane. To accelerate the process of unloading, we need this entire drive clear of cars.
